Toronto, ON – Late last year, L'Arche Toronto Homes Inc. (L'Arche Toronto) received a \$33,300 Resilient Communities Fund grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) to help offer programming in its homes, and enhanced programming for its two community inclusion programs. The Resilient Communities Fund grant program was developed to help non-profit organizations rebound and recover from the impacts of COVID-19.

"I am very pleased that the OTF made a grant to L'Arche Toronto for programming in its homes and the broader community," said Peter Tabuns, MPP for Toronto-Danforth. "L'Arche does excellent work and investing in them and the people they serve helps all of Ontario."

Thanks to the OTF grant, L'Arche Toronto Sol Express was able to create the Card Kit Project and sent out 50 kits to present and recent Sol Express participants, as well as its volunteers and supporters. The 50 kits, which included 10 cards, postage and other supplies, had the possibility to reach 500 people in the broader community. Through this outreach, a number of previous in-person participants took part because of additional support that was provided, and then went on to joining other on-line programs. Participants remained connected and had a positive effect on those with and without intellectual disabilities in the community who were also negatively affected by the pandemic. The OTF Resilient Communities Fund grant has also allowed L'Arche Toronto to offer high quality in-person and on-line programing to appeal to a variety of interests. For on-line sessions and workshops, artists/professionals enhanced the programs and gave a clear message to participants that they are valued and not forgotten, that COVID-19 does not have to stop them from growing, learning and engaging. Through programs and supplies, participants were engaged in different activities that could increase their skills, their sense of connectedness, sense of worth, thereby alleviating the sense of loss and loneliness they had feeling before and helping them to maintain good mental health.

"Virtual programming in many realms has fallen short but the Sol Express team has creatively succeeded in engaging people with intellectual disabilities and delighted them in the process and for this deserves enormous credit. Agnes talks about it all weekend and would not miss a session. Agnes particularly enjoyed taking part in the Card Kit Project," said Valerie Kenny, a Sol Express participant's parent.

L'Arche Toronto Homes Inc. (L'Arche Toronto) is a not-for-profit charity that helps persons with intellectual disabilities to discover their gifts and abilities and supports them to achieve their goals for a meaningful life.
